DOMAIN 9:	Improve and innovate public health functions through ongoing evaluation, research, and continuous quality improvement.
STANDARD 9.1:	Build and foster a culture of quality.
STANDARD 9.2:	Use and contribute to developing research, evidence, practice-based insights, and other forms of information for decision making.
	BUILD AND MAINTAIN A STRONG ORGANIZATIONAL INFRASTRUCTURE FOR PUBLIC HEALTH
DOMAIN 10	Build and maintain a strong organizational infrastructure for public health.
STANDARD 10.1:	Employ strategic planning skills.
STANDARD 10.2:	Manage financial, information management, and human resources effectively.
STANDARD 10.3:	Foster accountability and transparency within the organizational infrastructure to support ethical practice, decision-making, and governance.

The **PHAB STANDARDS** apply to all health departments—Tribal, military state, local, and territorial. Standards are the required level of achievement that a health department is expected to meet. Domains are groups of standards that pertain to a broad group of public health services. The focus of the PHAB standards is "what" the health department provides in services and activities, irrespective of "how" they are provided or through what organizational structure.
